







Why is research and innovation important?



Can we eradicate liver fluke?

- Liver fluke costs UK farmers around £300 million per year (€237 million);
- Research has shown that drug resistance is spreading;
- A new control strategy urgently needed;
- Research looking at targeting treatment from within the worm using molecular technologies;
- Roll out six events in the New Year for farmers around England.
